This year's conference promises to be especially exciting. Please read below the requirements and process for obtaining graduate credit through Furman University for this workshop.

1. Attend 15 clock hours of sessions. In order to meet this requirement you will need to attend almost the entire conference. If you must be absent from part of the conference, consider the evening sessions available on Thursday evening February 5.

In addition to regular sessions, you may count concerts, banquets (if there is a program and a speaker), divisional business meetings, and exhibit time viewing curricular materials.

2. Keep a diary of the events you attend. Type your notes and send them to me at the address below. This does not need be a lengthy transcript, but rather a synopsis of the things you learned or observed at each event. Evaluate the sessions as you deem appropriate, but a possible line of thought may be:

- a. Which clinician did you think was most effective and why?
- b. Did you hear any new music or find materials that would be effective in your teaching situation?
- c. Did you gather any advice or materials on advocacy that can assist you in your teaching situation?
- d. Would you recommend the clinician to a colleague?
- e. How did the conference/session help you grow as a musician a/o teacher?

3. In order for your transcript to be sent to the State Department of Education, a written request must be sent directly to the Office of Academic Records, Furman University, 3300 Poinsett Highway, Greenville, SC, 29613. There is no fee for this transcript service.
